



preacher, a teacher of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and a lover and creator of music. Randy lived, loved, breathed, and ate the Word of God; as well as MUSIC!! His life was a symphony: defined as a large-scale orchestral work made up of 4 movements and defined by contrasting moods and tempos; each having its own distinct character.

First Movement of Randy's Symphony: "In The Beginning"

December 21, 1978, a baby boy made his appearance in South Central Los Angeles to parents Randy Sr., Carol, and the Allison family. He was nicknamed "Little Randy", not because of his size, but for the convenience for Mama Carol who had two Randy's now to keep up with...Randy Sr. and Randy Jr! Mama Carol ran a tight ship, and those who sailed on her ship had to sail right or get off!! Her discipline made Randy Jr. one of the most respectful and respectable young men in the community. Soon after, the stork brought Porsche and the family of four Allisons started to make their own history. Randy Jr. spent his childhood doing what he loved...making Porsche cry on the way to school and church! He also longed to get close enough to the late great Jimmy Smith, just to wipe the sweat off of his face while playing the organ! He attended Sunday School every Sunday and his teachers, Sis. Moore and Mother Monroe really enjoyed him in class! He sang in the world-famous Pastor's Choir and Boys for Christ under the direction of Mother Andrews, Avis Powell and Cheryl Johnson. For many years his signature songs were "Im Yours Lord" and "I'll Be a Witness for the Lord". He accepted Jesus as his Lord and Savior and was baptized by the late great Pastor H.P. Rachal. Randy Jr. loved preaching as a child; it was his favorite thing to do. His love for music was kindled by the first keyboard that he received as a gift from Bro "Uncle" Albert Greene and he played and banged on it late at night and early in the morning, to the dismay of his parents. He and Jay McCool sneaked on the piano at church as much as possible, until they were run off by Mother Biggs and Mother Gentry! Randy Jr. was the musician for Sunday School and he played one chord and one key, but he got better...he started receiving lessons from Mama Andrews, then Sis. Metcalfe. He played the piano anytime he got a

chance! Grandmother Ruthie Allison gave him his first piano and he played it morning, noon and night! Randy Jr loved music, but he loved preaching more! He loved to imitate Pastor Rachal and would preach to animals, cars, kids, and anyone who would listen.

Second Movement of Randy's Symphony: "School Days, and the Call to Preach"

Mama Carol and Randy Sr. did NOT play when it came to education! They instilled in their children a love for learning, respect for teachers, and the educational process. One day Randy Jr. "lost" his report card in 2nd grade; Mama Carol "found" it and the "seat of education" was applied to our dear Randy Jr. He never lost another report card! He asked question upon question upon question in school, prompting one of his teachers to give him a daily limit... "5 questions Randy, that's it and that's all!" He soared like an eagle in school and was a top student. He was a proud graduate of Washington Preparatory High School and was the only student that had a whole school bus to himself thanks to Mama Andrews! He served the school in many capacities: member of the marching and world-famous jazz band, Student Body President, Honor Roll member; and he received many accolades and certificates too numerous to mention. His dream was to attend Grambling State University and become a Fighting Tiger. That is exactly what he did! He played for the Grambling Gospel Choir, Voices of Faith and several churches in Louisiana. He also made Mount Zion Baptist his church away from home. 4 years later, his large "FAN CLUB" from Los Angeles journeyed to Grambling in December of 2002 to see him cross the stage as he earned a B.A in Public Administration. His love for learning continued at Azusa Pacific where he earned a Master's Degree in Pastoral Studies. Randy Jr felt a tugging and calling on his soul, and that was God calling him to preach the word!

On February 5, 1995, at age 16, he preached his very first sermon at Greater New Unity. There was standing room only and the spirit had its way! Dr. H.P. Rachal licensed him to preach on May 31, 1998, and was the overseer of his Ordination,

along with the Pastors and Leaders of the Providence District Baptist Association. Rev. Randy Allison emerged and he preached, sang, served and preached some more! God gave him a gift to spread the gospel and he did exactly that.

Third Movement of Randy's Symphony: "Carrying the Torch" and "Love is in the Air"

On November 27, 2006 our beloved Pastor, Dr. H.P. Rachal went home to be with the lord. Dr. Rachel had been training Rev. Allison to be a leader since he was a child, and Rev. Allison served as his Assistant Pastor for 3 years. In God's order, Rev. Allison accepted the torch that was passed to him and became the 8th Pastor of Greater New Unity on February 4, 2007 at the tender age of 29. To God be the glory for the training and teaching he received, and the prayers prayed over him as he took the reins of Greater New Unity.

In January 2007 Pastor Allison joined Victory Baptist Church under the leadership of W. Edward Jenkins. Nothing was more important to Randy than God, Greater New Unity, the piano/organ, singing, family and friends. UNTIL....February 21, 2003 when Rev. Allison fell in love. Oh yes, he fell and her name was Tiffany Brown; it was a beautiful courtship. He popped the question and of course she said YES!! On July 21, 2007 Randy and Tiffany were united in holy matrimony and he was one of the happiest men on earth! We were all so very happy they had found love and vowed to make each other happy for life.

Fourth Movement of Randy's Symphony: "The Grand Finale"

For the past 17 years, Pastor Randy Allison Jr. preached, taught, baptized, and led souls to Christ. He served his community, fellow clergy as the Executive Secretary, 1st, 2nd and 3rd Vice Moderator of the great Providence District Baptist Association, and faithfully attended the Baptist Ministers Conference. He was gainfully employed as a school principal, teacher, hospice chaplain, and shared his musical talents with various churches, groups and artists that are too numerous to mention. He played with integrity and to the GLORY OF GOD, not to the adulation of man. His last time on earth was spent with his flock fellowshipping, laughing, eating, and having a great time! For the last time, he entered the sanctuary andhelped the men at choir rehearsal, correcting, suggesting and trying, as always, to get the music perfect; again to the glory of God!

So why is the Symphony in C Major? C Major because the C stands for CROWN OF RIGHTEOUSNESS, and that is what he has received....The Conductor of his Symphony has been the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and he has helped our beloved Pastor Allison make beautiful music his entire life by leading souls to Christ; comforting the grief stricken and supporting those who needed it most. On April 21, 2024 the Conductor waved his baton at Pastor Allison signaling him to slow down the tempo, play a few more chords, and then that golden chariot swung real low and came and got Pastor Allison just as he played his last note. His Crown of Righteousness was waiting. Well done and bravo Pastor Allison...Bravo!!


